

Location

Turangi

Character

High water canyon with small abseils and committing gorges.

This canyon has only been done once. We recorded limited details but intend to go back. It is still very exploratory. Treat it as a first descent.

Start of canyon: -39.211673, 175.687222

Approach by Car

Drive south from Turangi along SH1. There's a small gravel road at the start of the Waihohonu track which has a car park. We also left a car at the bridge over the Waihohonu to make the walk a few kilometers shorter.

Approach on Foot

Follow the Waihohonu track until it gets close to the river, then bash over to the river. The river is flat with no features for the first kilometer or so.

Rock

Limestone

Water

High water, people kayak this. Recommended to only do this at the tail end of summer when there's no snow melt so flows are lower.

Catchment

Massive

Anchors

A few natural anchors, we left almost no gear. It is recommended the next group takes some bolting equipment.

Gear

2 x 30m ropes

Route Description

This is a long canyon, in terms of distance, with a lot of flow. There are numerous short, committing gorges with different whitewater features to navigate and lots of recirculations to avoid.

Time

Full day

Dangers

Flash flood – only touch this in the driest times Recirculations Undercuts Sieves/siphons


Escapes

Each gorge is short and you can walk around them if they're too much. Once you're in one of the gorges, you are committed to the end of that gorge though.
